

COOKIE POLICY

Introduction

CMAC Healthcare Consulting & Financial Services ("CMAC" and "our") uses cookies and similar technologies on our Website www.cmac.co.za (CMAC Official and Only Website)(hereinafter: "our Website"). By using our Website, we gather standard internet visitor usage information. We do not use cookies to track internet usage of our users after leaving our Website, nor do we sell or distribute information. This policy explains what cookies are, how we use them, and your choices regarding them. By continuing to use our website, you consent to our use of cookies.

What are Cookies?

A cookie is a small text file saved on your computer or device by your internet browser when you visit our website. They are used to improve website functionality and user experience. By "Cookies" we mean "Cookies and similar technologies" and apply the same consent rule to similar technologies in accordance with applicable data protection laws. Cookies may include Strictly Necessary Cookies (needed for our Website to function properly), Performance Cookies (server logs – to monitor and analyse the use of our Website), Functional Cookies (to enhance functionality of our Website and personalise elements to our Website and provide services you asked for) and Targeting Cookies (to show advertisements and other content likely interested in).

Script: A piece of program code used to make the Website function properly and interactively executed on our server or your device.

Web Beacons (pixel tag): A small, invisible piece of text or image used to monitor traffic on a website.

Various data is stored using web beacons.

Types of Cookies We Use

- **Essential/Strictly Necessary Cookies:** Required for the website to operate (e.g. logging in, security).
- **Performance/Analytical Cookies:** Collect anonymous information about how visitors use the site to improve performance.
- **Functional Cookies:** Remember choices you make (e.g. language, user preferences).
- **Third-Party Cookies:** Set by external partners (e.g. Google Analytics, social media plugins) for tracking or marketing purposes.

How to Manage/Disable Cookies

Most browsers allow you to manage, block, or delete cookies through their settings. Deactivating cookies may prevent you from using certain parts of our website. When you use our Website, we will prompt a pop-up with explaining cookies. You may consent or decline. You may disable the use of cookies via your browser, be aware that our Website may not work properly if disabled. You may use your internet browser to automatically or manually delete cookies, specify certain cookies may not be used or change the settings to receive a message each time a cookie is placed.

POPIA Compliance

We process personal information obtained through cookies in compliance with POPIA, ensuring data is used only for the stated purposes, such as improving site functionality and providing personalized content.
